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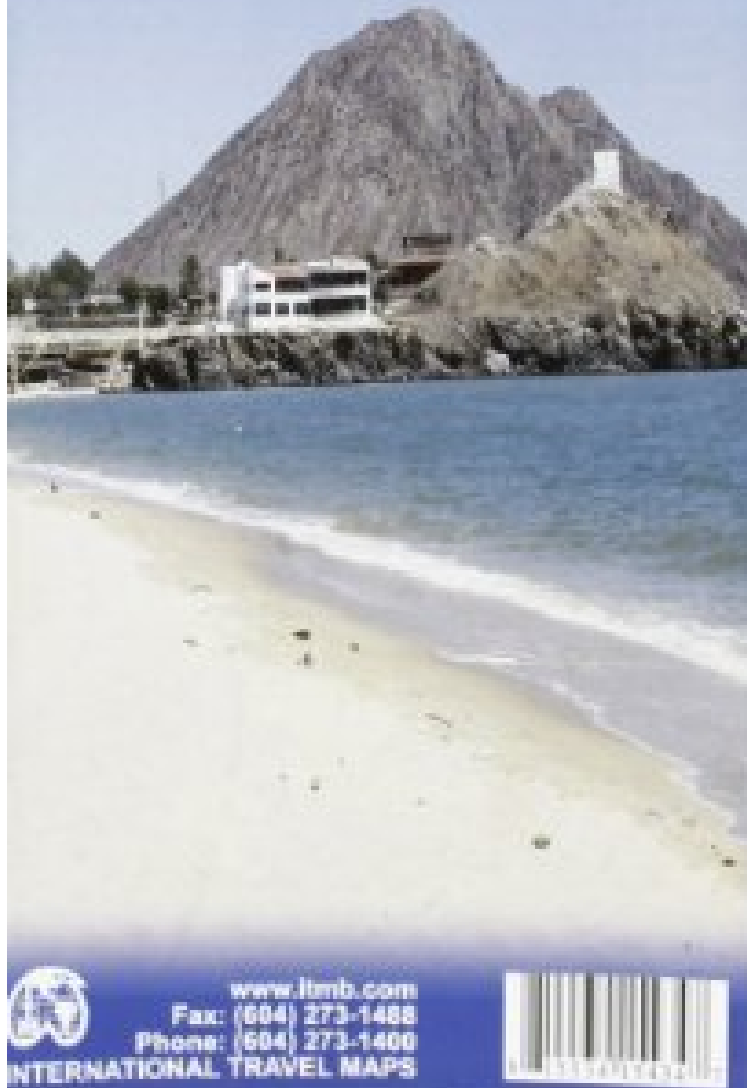

I believe if you know what 1:650,000 will get you, then you will be super pleased. On one side is N. Baja, on other side is S. Baja.
