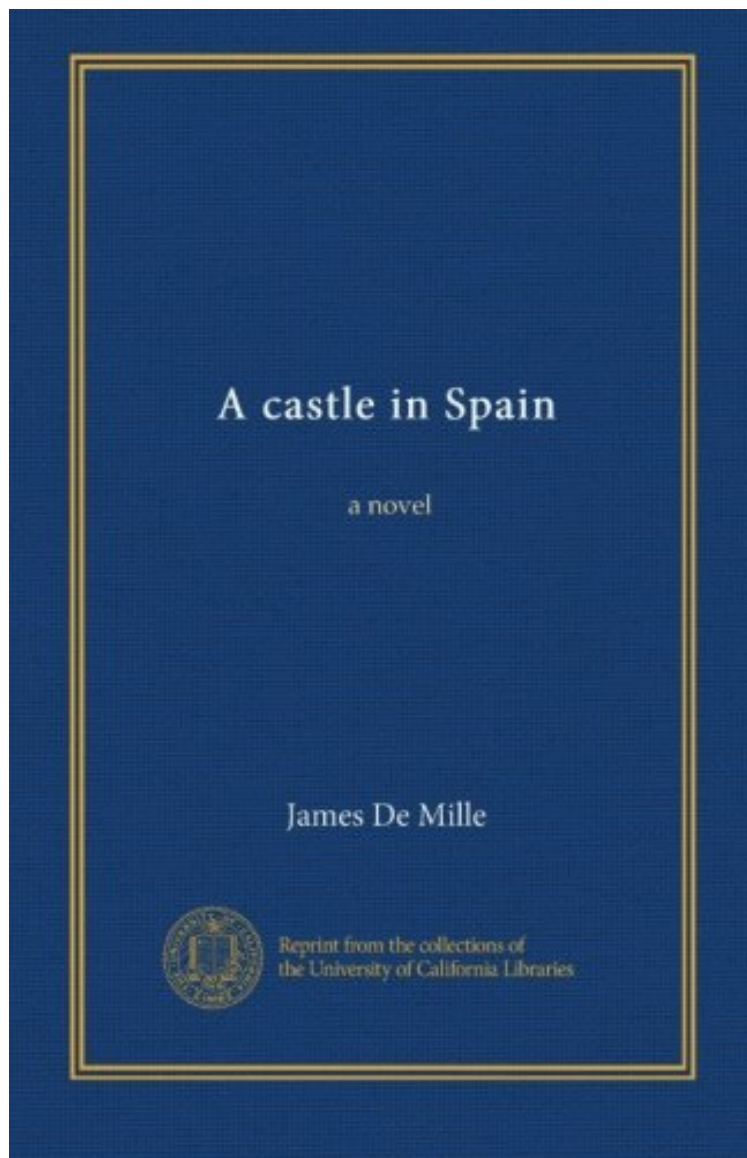

She has two suitors (Lopez and Ashby) come to see her off, but this story is not a typical love triangle. It's more of a love dodecahedron.Katie's travels are interrupted by Carlists (bandits), who kidnap her, her guardians, and two young men, taking them to an old, abandoned castle.While Ashby is courting Katie, he unexpectedly runs into Dolores, who he has a history with in

Valencia. Ashby's friend Harry Rivers is captured by the Carlists at the same time as Katie, and Harry and Katie become quite close. In the meantime, Harry's intended (Ms. Sydney Talbot) runs into Brooke, an American who is travelling incognito as the Cure of Santa Cruz. The two of them are captured by Republicans and experience adventures of their own. Oddly, Lopez is now a Captain with the Republicans who capture them. Katie's guardian, Russell, enlists the help of Rita to escape. Due to language difficulties, this Carlist girl assumes Russell is in love with her. But after escaping the Carlists, they are both captured by the Republicans. When there is an altercation with Carlists, Russell is freed from the misunderstanding when Rita escapes again. After everyone is freed, Dolores realizes that Brooke is actually Raleigh, who she had a history with in Cuba and had not seen since. Naturally all of the characters are embarrassed to have been false to each other, but the ending is happy. King Charles (Don Carlos) meets them as they are escaping with the ACTUAL Cure of Santa Cruz, who performs a marriage ceremony--I won't ruin it by telling you who gets married.
