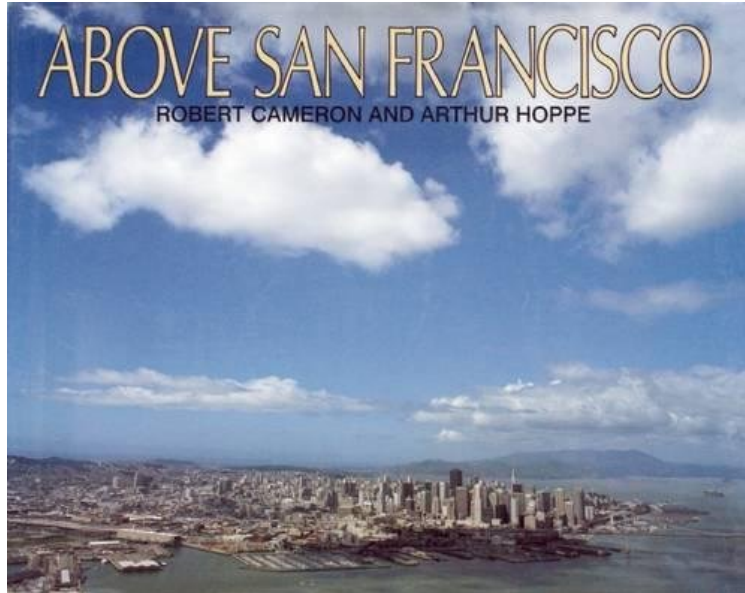

These postcards have a matte finish so the photos don't look quite as spectacular as they could, but these are still lovely postcards. There are images that you'd expect, such as the Golden Gate Bridge from the air (which doesn't detract from a great image). And some were a surprise. I liked the one showing the Academy of Science's green roof. I've been to this museum in Golden Gate Park many times, and that includes the viewing platform you can access for the "living" roof. But to see it like this postcard from the air is a treat.Each postcard is 6 " x 4 ". The cardstock is a little thicker than usual. I'm going to play it safe and use full first-pounce postage on these cards.The cards arrive gummed in a stack. I found that they can be removed out of of order, from the middle of the stack, if I'm careful. The exception is the last postcard, which is for some reason glued in. You have to tear off part of the message side to remove it. It's still useable, but odd.A nice set published by Cameron.Happy Reader3 of 3 people found the following review helpful. Cameron is a member of the Royal Photographic Society and a member of the Presidents Council of the International Center of Photography. His work has been exhibited in Paris at La Bibliotheque Historique and the Foundation Mona Bismarck. In New York at the International Center of Photography, the New York City Municipal Arts Foundation. In San Francisco at the Vision Gallery, City Hall and the Pacific Center for Photographic Arts. In Chicago's O'Hare airport. In China at the New Gallery of Art in Shanghai and at the Forbidden City. Cameron is currently working on his highly anticipated new book "Above Mexico City".
