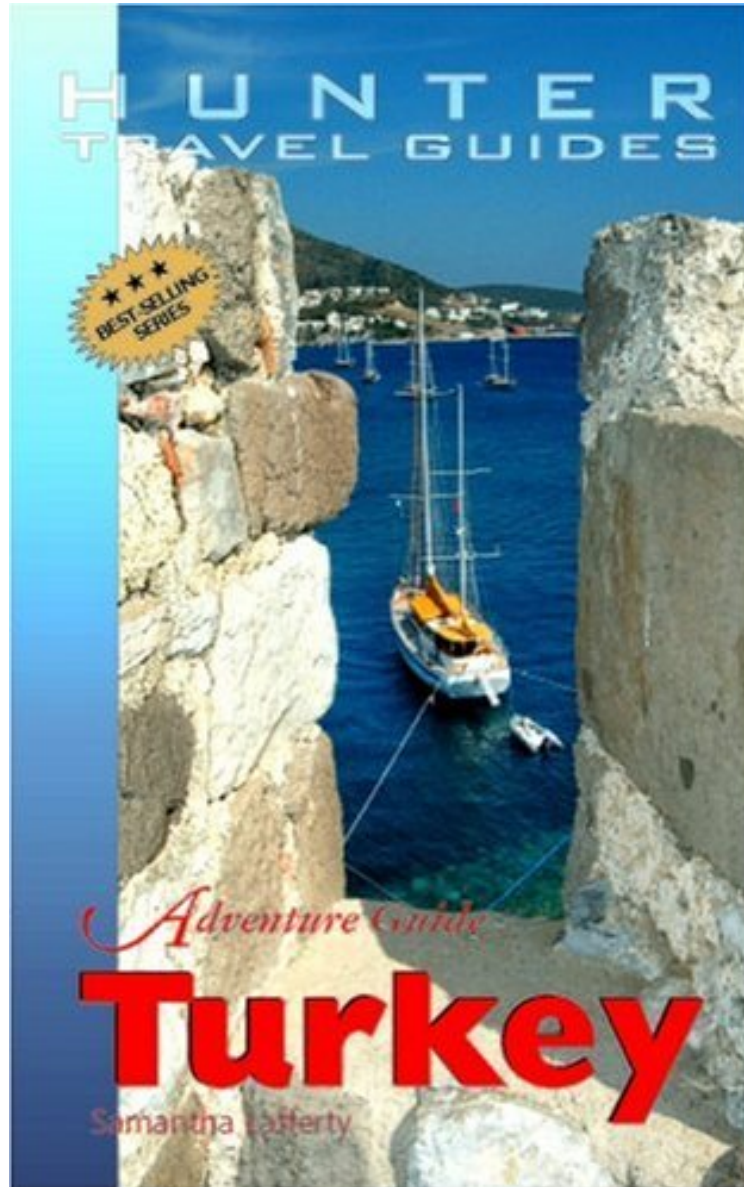

Contrary to the comment dated Feb 2009, the Kindle edition still does not contain a Table of Contents. When you buy a Kindle-based guidebook look for one that offers both TOC and copious internal linking to allow navigation within the book. For example, the introductory paragraph to any region should be cross-linked to the information for each top sight in that region. In addition to the lack of internal navigation, the Lafferty's guide also lacks the level of detail required to make it your sole guidebook for the trip. For example, it lacks detailed information about how to get to or use the Istanbul bus station. Even the adventure content falls short of expectations. For example, the information about kitesurfing/windsurfing near Bodrum is minimal. You might find this guidebook useful as a supplement, but I think most people would be better served by "standard" guidebooks and the use of the internet to find your adventure activity providers. I ended up buying a "regular" guidebook during the trip. Thank goodness for Kindle international 3G access!

The book does not have an index or a table of contents. So as a travel guidebook that you do not read from front to back, it is completely useless. I will try to get my money back.

Turkey is so diverse it could almost be described as a continent rather than a country. In the west, mountains and pine forests frame a staggeringly beautiful coastline. The central steppe has the peculiar rock churches and underground cities of Cappadocia and the cosmopolitan capital of Ankara. In the east, there are biblical rivers, a fabled mountain and haunting cities and palaces. Then, there is the magnetism of Istanbul. Turkey's location straddles Asia and Europe. The three great Empires that ruled the country for thousands of years left a legacy of enchanting cultures and more ancient sites than even Italy or Greece can boast. Major areas dealt with in the guide include Istanbul, Thrace and Marmara, the Aegean Coast, the Mediterranean Coast, Central Anatolia, Cappadocia, the Black Sea Coast. Covered in detail for each area are where to stay, where to eat, shopping, sightseeing and adventures, both cultural and physical from walking in the footsteps of St. Paul to joining in the local festivals, from yoga and Turkish baths to art classes and cooking courses. This guide combines in-depth text information with color maps photos on almost every page. Existing guides are largely text-only or mostly graphics and lacking the practical details travelers need.
