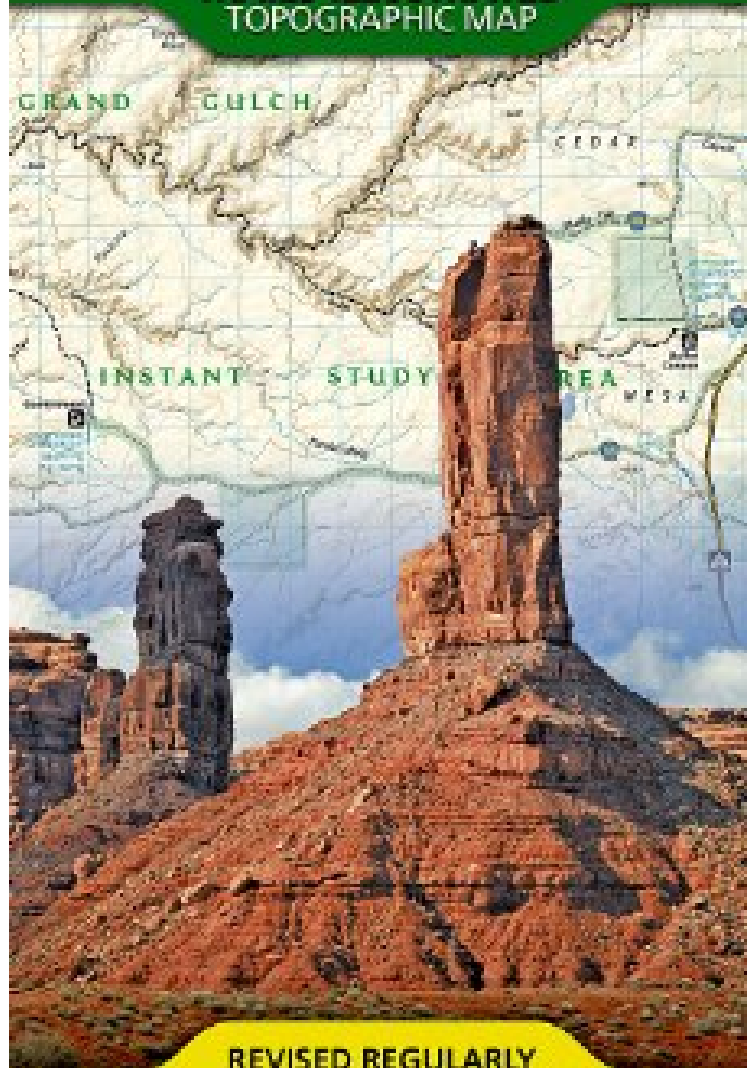

The scale most Trails Illustrated maps are printed at does not provide enough detail to truly find your way around a canyon.
