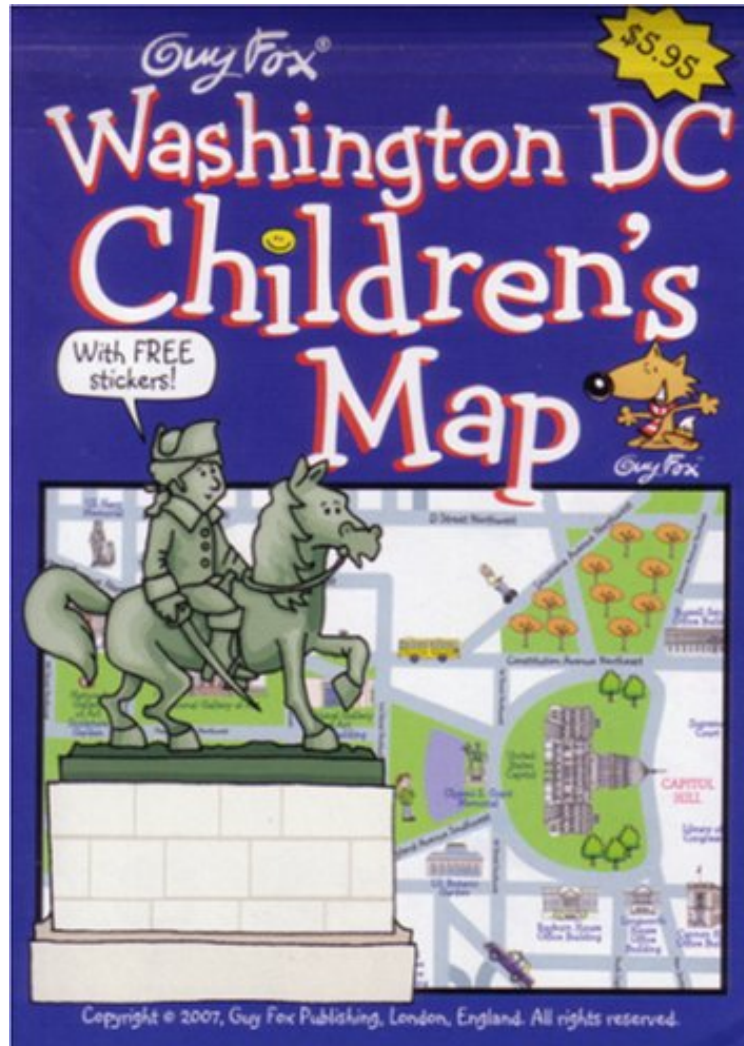

Great map, not necessarily just for kids By Barbi I originally had purchased this map for my 8 year old son to look at before we went on our trip to DC. It looks similar to a map from Sea World or Disney World. Its very large scale, showing major roads and places of interest. Its very easy to read. It isn't necessarily to scale. This map turned out to be quite helpful to me during our trip. I used it in conjunction with a pocket metrorail map. The metrorail map was very detailed. It showed all the streets downtown and all the metro stops and is to scale. However, the print is really small and sometimes hard to read. I didn't carry my reading glasses with me when we were walking. I used the children's map as a macro "where do we want to go" map. You could unfold it

and have a family stand around and look at it to decide since everything was so big. Then I used the pocket metroraill map as a detailed "how do we get there" map.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful. Ok mapBy Six months pregnantThis was an ok map. On the good side, it was large print, easy to read and had nice and clear designations for the big sites. But on the down side it didn't fold out to a fully open position. Instead, on one side of the paper was half of DC and then you needed to flip over the paper for the other half of DC. I think that made it a little confusing as a kids map. They sat in the back seat while we were driving around D.C. looking at where they had been and where they were going to go. I was looking forward to using the stickers to mark where we had been, but there were ones we couldn't use ("we slept here" -- who can afford to stay in D.C. proper?) and others of the "we saw this" variety that there weren't enough of. It was even a help to us parents when we couldn't find something on our big fancy map from AAA since this map is much simpler, bigger, and easier to read.

Guy Fox's Children's Maps are colorful, simplified and easy to use and designed to fit in the smallest of pockets. Vivid illustrations and bold lettering help children pick the destinations and plan the route for a day out on the town. Included with the map is a sheet of fun stickers to mark favorite spots. 2007.
