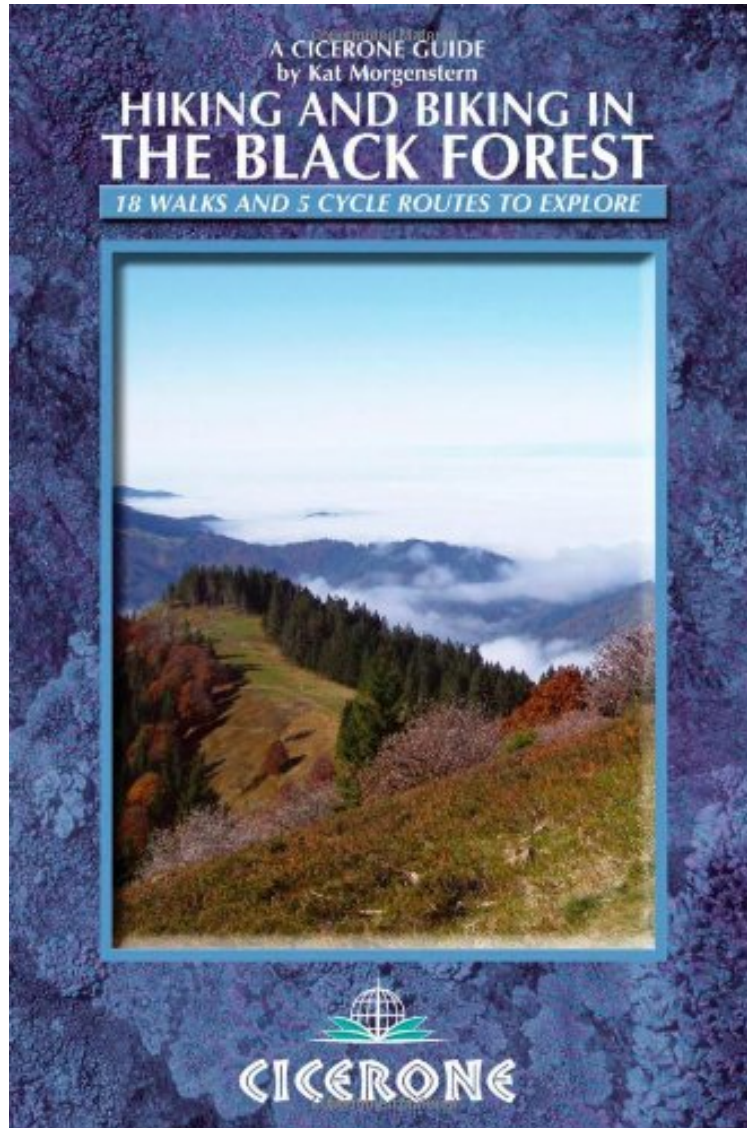

characterized by one or two highlights, it offers a uniquely harmonious blend of culture and nature that reflects the traditional lifestyle of this region. It is a destination for romantics, full of the charms of yesteryear but also making the most of what modern life has to offer. An excellent public transport service and infrastructure make it easy to access the extensive trail system. Charming towns and villages offer simple, but comfortable accommodations, exquisite local cuisine, excellent wines and affordable day spas.
