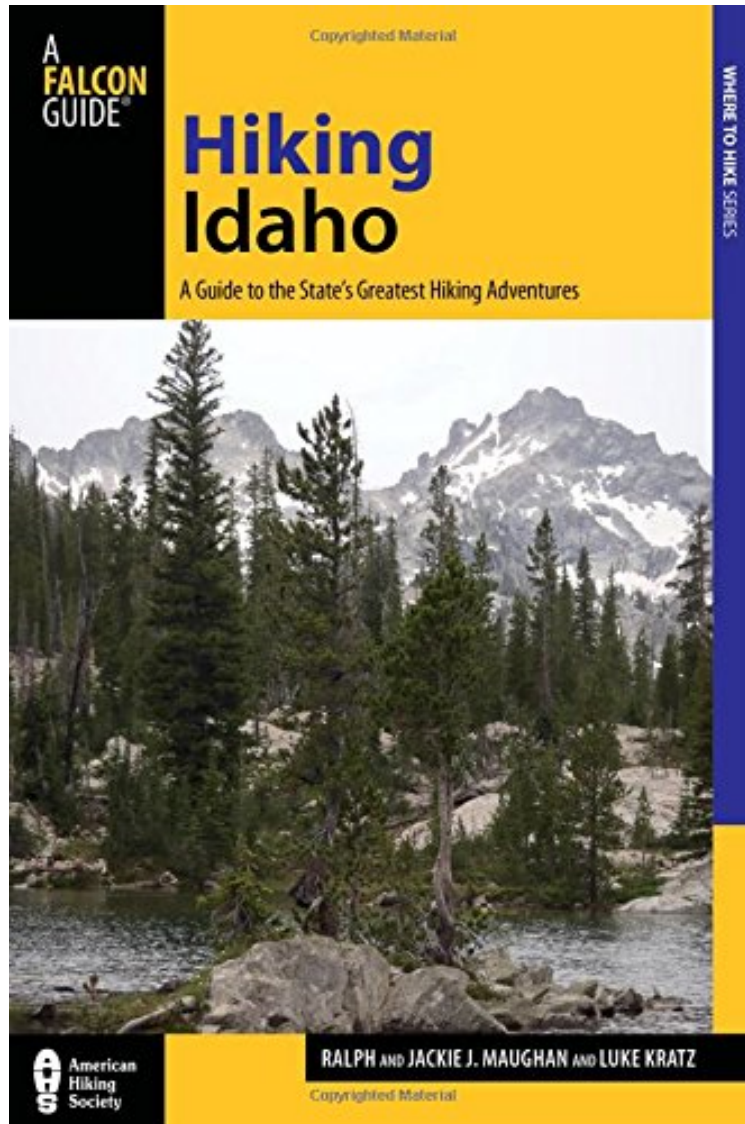

I tried three different hikes from this book while on vacation and in every case I found either the map to be inaccurate or incomplete, the write up to be inaccurate or incomplete, or in one case BOTH to be wrong. The maps lacked detail and omitted significant landmarks and/or other trails, the write up neglected to mention key navigation points or simply got them wrong, and the descriptions were rife with error. Do yourself a favor and get any book OTHER than this one.
