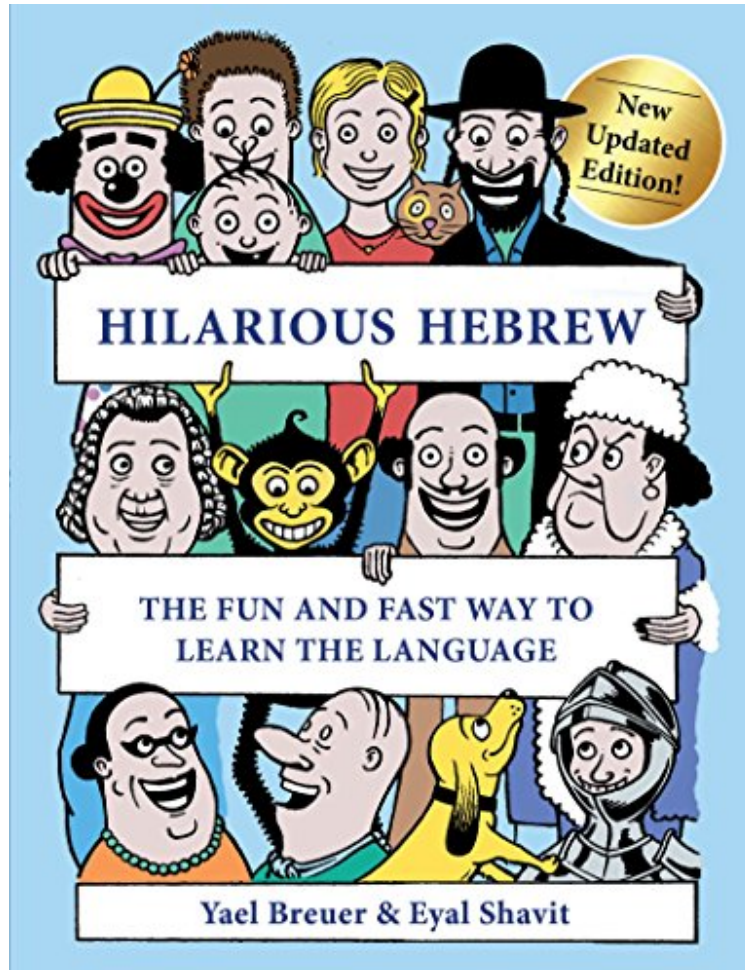

The result is a slim, richly illustrated and frequently funny pocket book by Yael Breuer and Eyal Shavit titled Hilarious Hebrew and billed as the fun and fast way to learn the language. For instance, a cartoon shows a mountain climber and his unhappy dog getting soaked in the rain, with the man exclaiming, OH, HELL. We forgot the TENT. Below is the linguistic link: The Hebrew word for 'TENT' is OHEL. The final word is spelled out in both English and Hebrew letters. The first to test the efficacy of the authors' teaching method was Smith, a gentile Brit, who absorbed many Hebrew words while doing the illustrations for the book. Breuer said she is perhaps proudest of the comment from a student she had tutored 22 years earlier and had recently met again.
