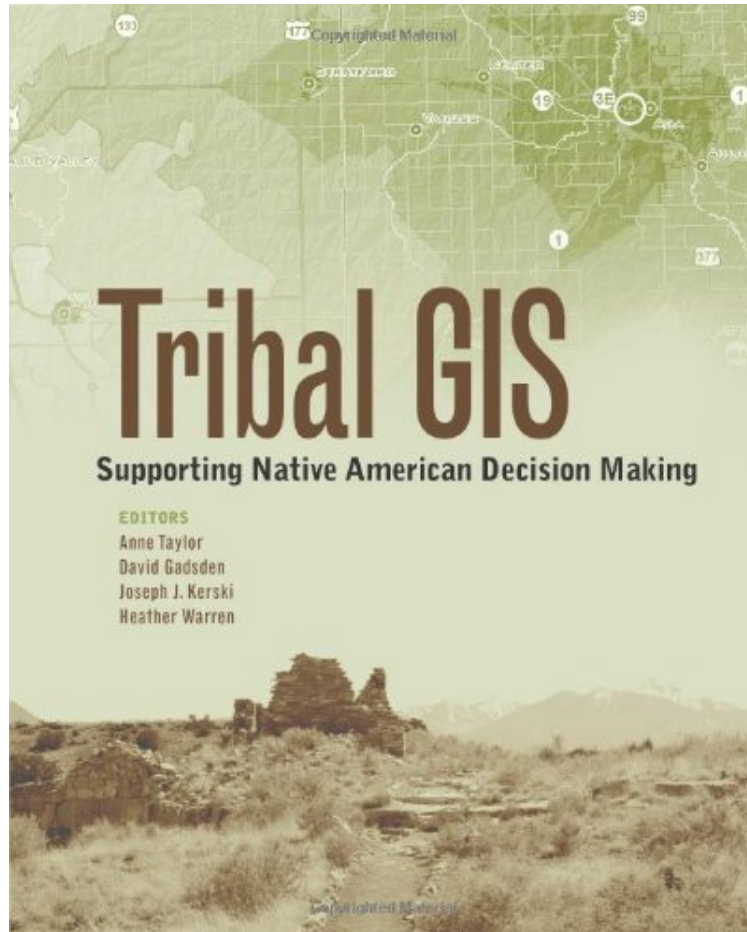

They are case studies on "how" Tribes are using GIS. Each case study is 4-8 pages, and from what I've read so far, offers very little methodology. "Hey GIS is good this way and that way and look at what they did" over and over.Example, one of the Cultural resource management section case studies lists all the players, throws a bunch of acreage stats at you and basically tells you that they use GIS to manage the land. Pretty weak.
