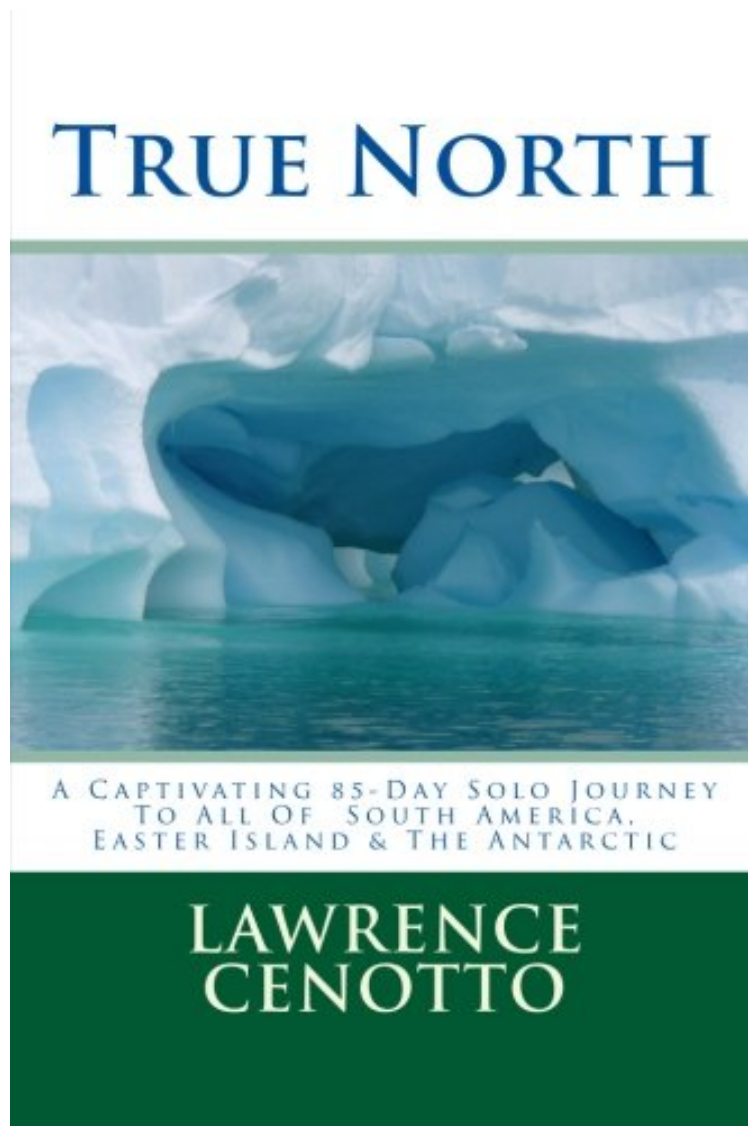

Lawrence Cenotto has woven together a colorful travel tapestry artfully blending threads of refreshing authentic narrative, against a backdrop of solid history, culture and geography, laced with silver strands of philosophic and spiritual musings most of us ponder. Why do we take the risk to travel at all; what meaning do we seek to discover about ourselves and our world? From the first page I was swept along the 85 day journey with a humorous unpretentious friendly soul; albeit one more ballsy than most 'normal' travelers. He made me laugh at absurd conditions, freeze during a plunge into icy Antarctic seas, feel panic at his slippery climb up steep stairs in Machu Picchu, curse the greedy travel abuse in Venezuela. I refined my must see list. Throughout, kindness of 'road angels' everywhere and the generosity of strangers prevailed. I recognized my own reasons for loving 'freestyle' travel opportunities, with a few tweaks for not getting stranded in no exit out locations. Especially helpful was the appendix, "Mistakes Made, Lessons Learned", wisdom not to be ignored if you want to survive foreign travel anywhere, but especially on the road less traveled. I was a bit disappointed to only see grainy black and white photos, but discovered that quality ones are on Cenotto's website. Prospective travelers should skip the flowery descriptions and stick with a legitimate travel guide.

Nearly everything that is a "must see" in South America is described in this adventure, from Easter Island, to Machu Picchu, The Sacred Valley of The Incas, the notorious "Road of Death" in Bolivia, Tiwanaku, the beaches of Ecuador, Ollantaytambo, the Floating Islands of the Uros Indians on Lake Titicaca, Iguazu Falls, Angel Falls, Carnival in Rio, many Unesco World Heritage sites such as Cartagena and Cuzco, most major cities on the continent, and a few Caribbean island retreats on the way out. This is NOT a travel guide. This is Travel drama at its best, with a surprising blend of personal revelation and transformation layered in with always insightful observations as a result of colorful, unexpected, sometimes difficult but very well-written adventures on the road. The reader of "True North" will get a broad introduction to top South American travel spots, experience startling moments of recognition, and enjoy frequent moments of delight and discovery.
