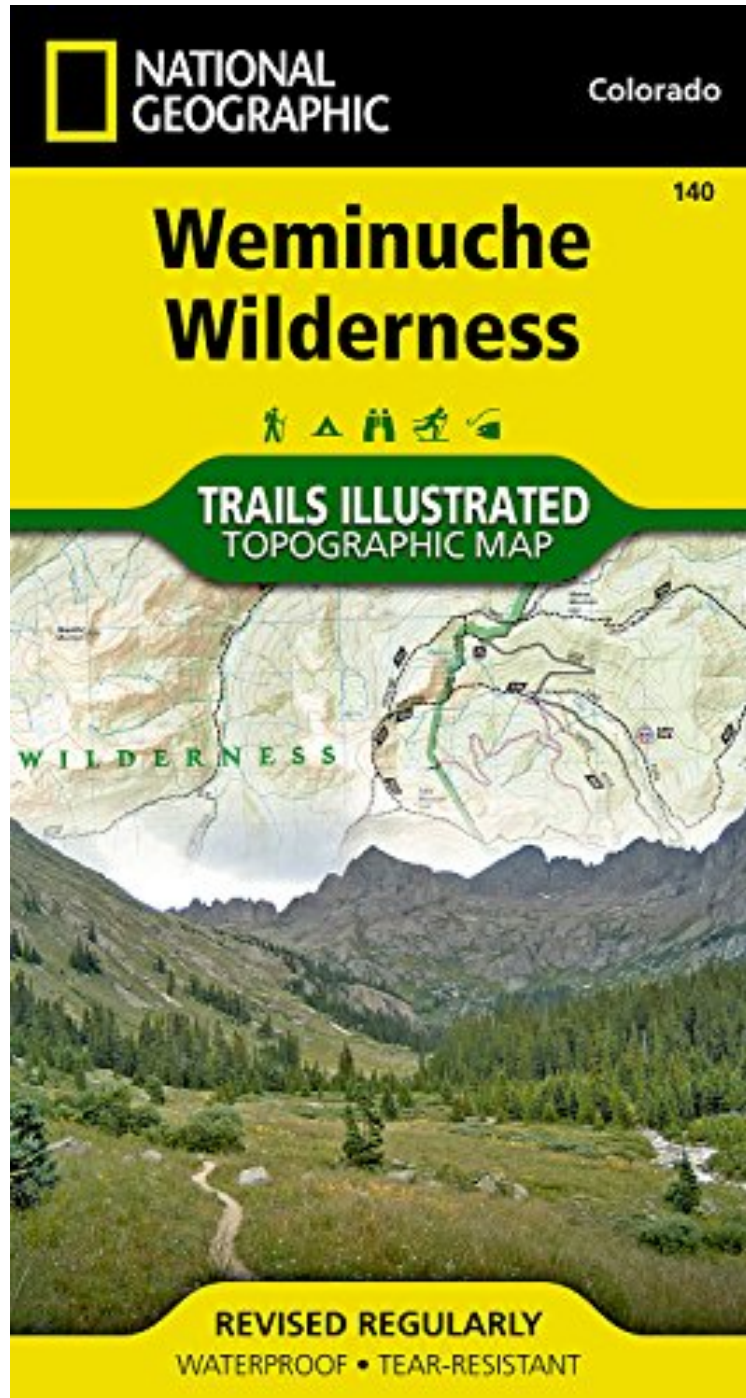

Sufficient for planning and picking a destination from within the whole area, but needs different scale for better route-finding. The map's scale is 1:63,360 and the map unfolds to 25.5" x 37.75". That means that the forty mile Elk Park-Needleton loop takes up approximately 1/8th of the map. It's not fatal, and considering that most people aren't trained to use a map and compass properly, it'll be the only map that will be usable by a majority. It does give you a great overview of the entire massive Weminuche area, which is great when you want to look around the whole area to plan your next adventure. However, I do use map and compass. And since the Weminuche has a bunch of really tall, pointy mountains, really close together, they look very similar on the map, and it would have been easier to have a map with a scale of 1:24,000 or so to pick out the shapes of these to triangulate locations. Also, some of the Weminuche trail markers and trail branches are not as clear as other trails (not saying signs are all absent, or that signage/trails are completely unclear, or that no trail signage is bad - adventure! - just that many other places in the lower 48 have ridiculously clear trails and signage compared to this area). Some trails (like the El Dorado lake spur trail) are not even on this map. That said, the trails which are indicated on this map are very clear, and the elevation shading is helpful when quickly estimating how far up and down you'll be going. Also the waterproofing is very water resistant. All in all, not a waste of money, but it probably was the wrong product for my purposes.  
CONS: 1. Fairly high scale; great for trip planning, not so great for route-finding. 2. Not all seemingly frequently-used trails are indicated. PROS: 1. Trails which are marked are super clear on the map. 2. Elevation shading is clear and handy for eyeballing elevation gains/losses on a hike. 3.
