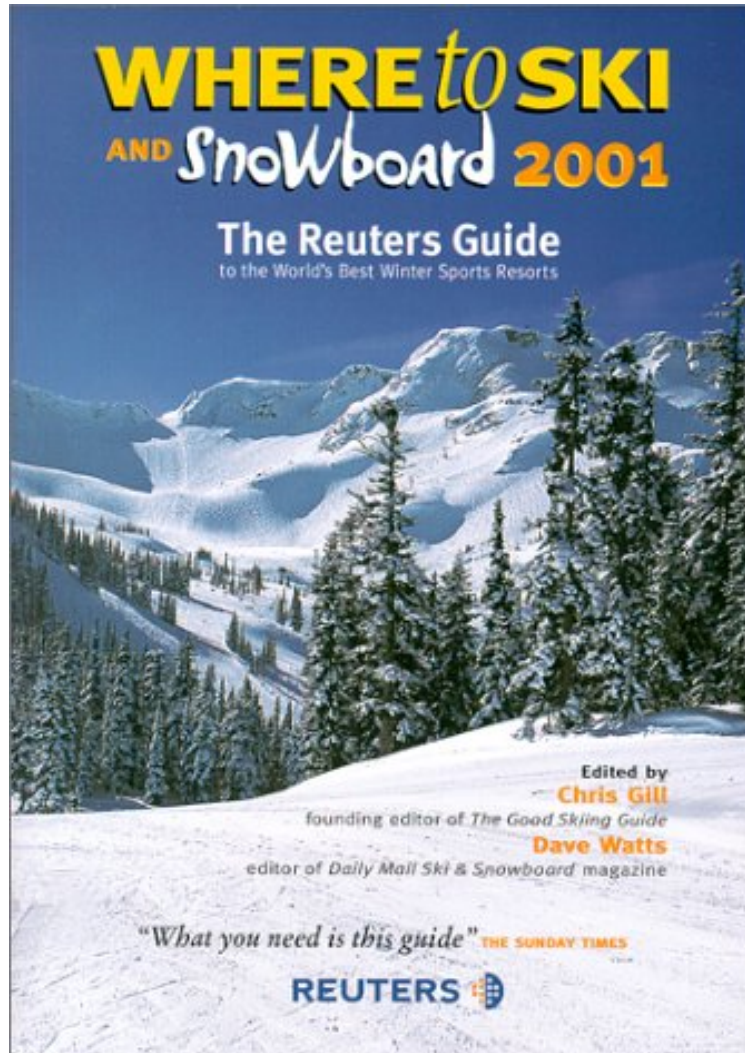

Dave Watts: Dave Watts is an Economist by training and was Editor of Which? (the UK equivalent of Consumer Reports) when he discovered skiing and became hooked. A couple of years later he changed his career, started Where to Ski Snowboard with Chris Gill and became editor of Britain's biggest Ski Snowboard magazine. He has visited over 300 resorts in Europe and North America.
