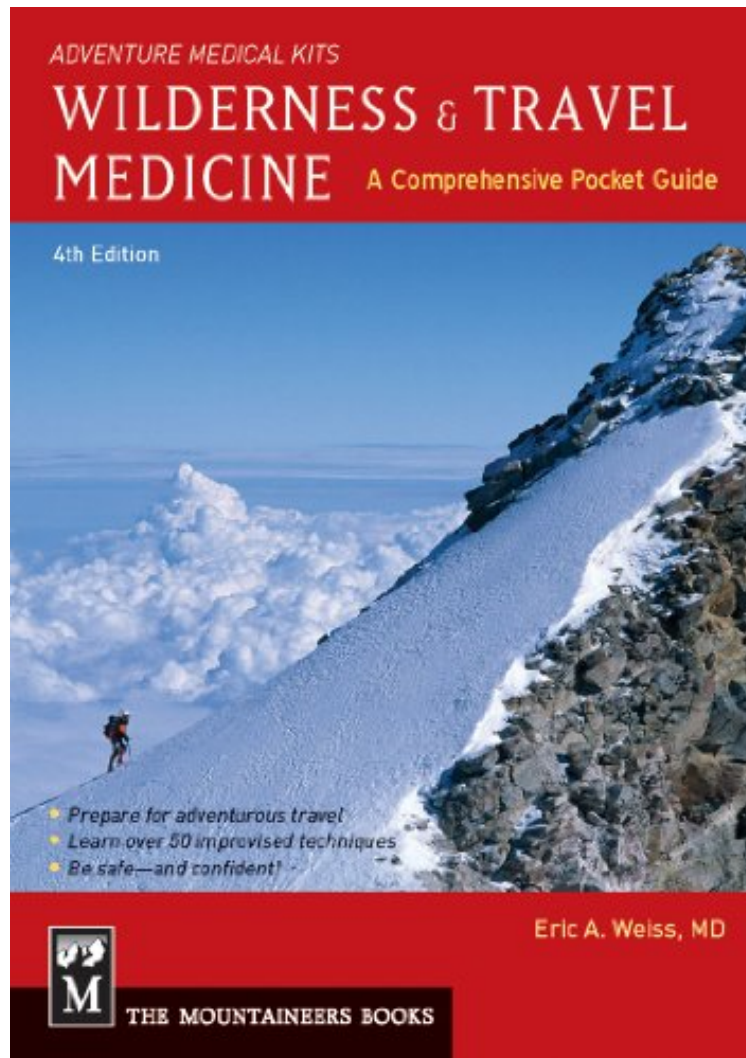

First, it is important to mention that for outdoor usage, the BW kindle blows all other products out of the water -- color kindle, iPhones, android, tablet computers are ALL generally useless compared to the BW kindle in outdoor situations. I intend to bring the kindle on wilderness expeditions (I am a certified WFRer), and I then wanted to get a good WFA book. This would not have been my first choice, there is another one that is used in the training program which I received my certification from that I liked slightly better. For my purposes, familiarity is important, and I also find Weiss slightly less handy as a look-up

reference. However, it is well renowned and I do not regret my purchase whatsoever, it is going to fulfill my needs.
