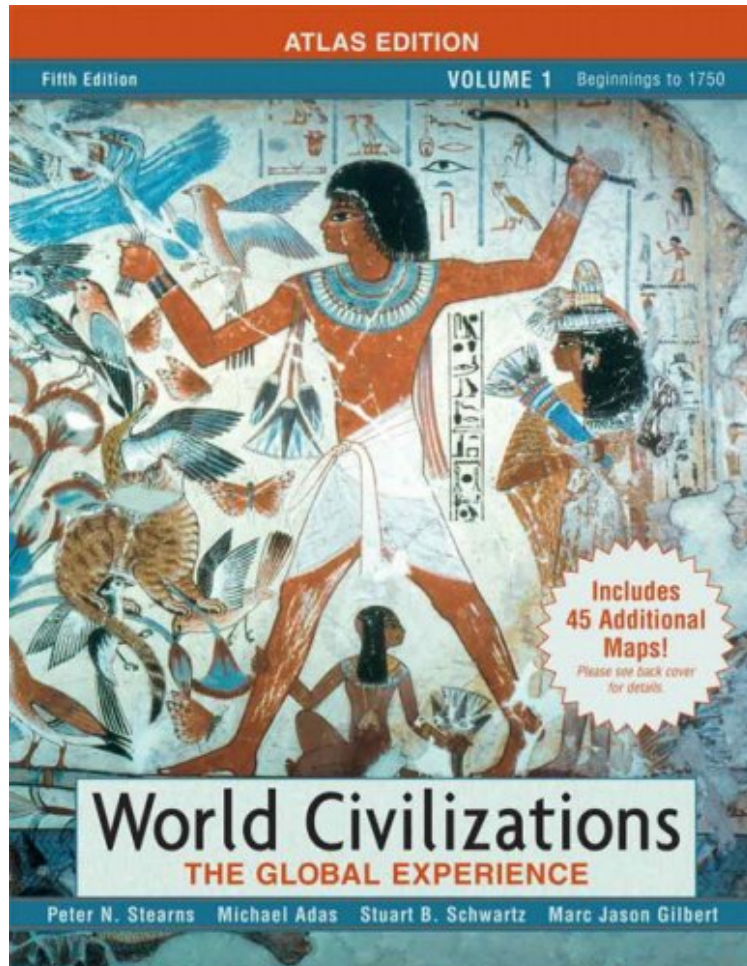

I have been teaching with the Strayer textbook for three years. It is also excellent, but it was not an AP version per se.
