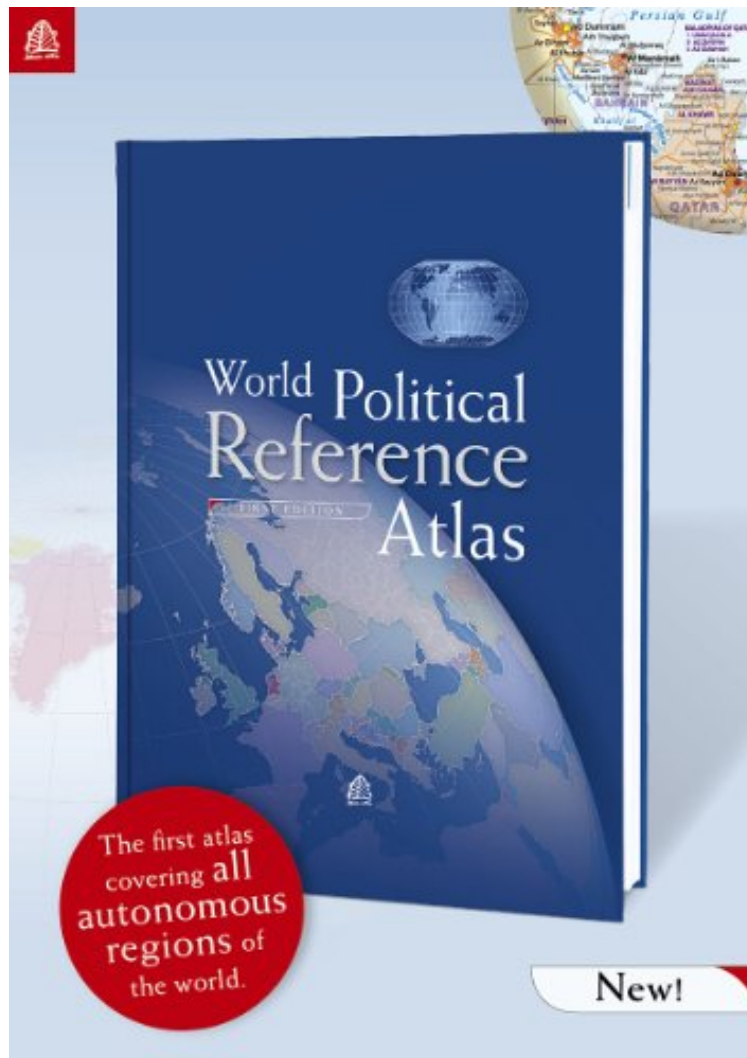

myself reaching for my full size Nat Geo and Times atlases when I want to look at the world! Of course, this is intended as a reference atlas rather than a standard 'world' atlas, which invariably means less detailed maps and more reference data on each country and region. Published and printed in Latvia! At around \$50-70 it is rather uncompetitive. It costs as much as one of the 'new old stock' superseded full size world atlases from the big name publishers that can still be purchased on . Second hand items in good condition can be acquired for even less. Anyone who wanted a good atlas but couldn't afford the \$100 needed to make the purchase would be far better off buying a 'new old stock' or second hand item from The Times, Nat Geo or Britannica. With all their shortcomings and despite being a few years "out of date", you would still get more atlas for your money. As far as the national reference data is concerned, much of it is already out of date by the time of printing, so the internet is a better source of this information, anyway.
