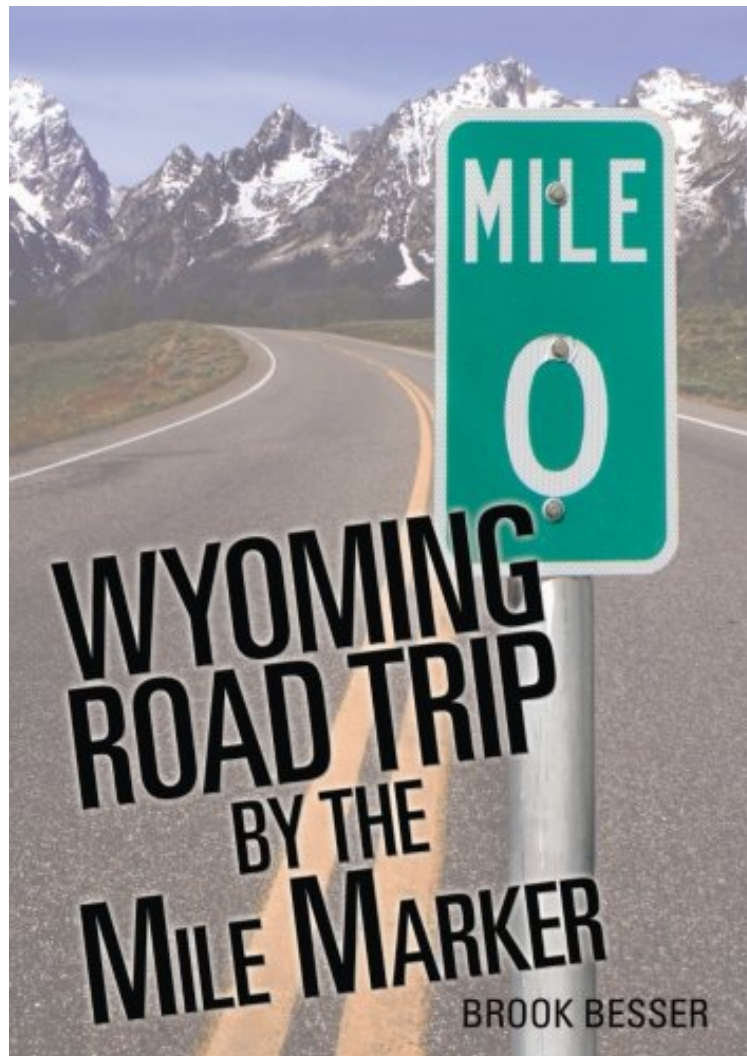

Fantastic book for the road trip through WY!By CoccozelleThis book provides wonderfully detailed descriptions of things along the various highways and byways in the entire state. It's very useful for the traveler for finding interesting things to stop at along the long and often boring (i.e. nothing but sagebrush) roads in Wyoming. I'm reading the book in preparation for a road trip to Yellowstone and already found several neat attractions to check out during our drive, such as a little state park that used to be a quarry where the kids can go swimming for an hour while we have a picnic lunch; or the county park with a natural bridge and a creek and shade and free camping. These kinds of places were not mentioned in my other Wyoming guidebooks. The author seems to actually have researched places very thoroughly; he'll mention things like "the campsites are just mowed weeds", or "they don't take credit cards", or "the city told me there were 20 campsites but...", and he provides useful information on how much shade is available (shade is apparently scarce in WY), or how good (or not so good) the road is.

I believe every road in the state is listed along with descriptions denoted by the mile-marker. This is not a narrated travel guide nor does the author show any bias regarding what can be found along the way. I can only imagine the work and time it took to accomplish this book. By using and reading it I have found interesting things and sites (in a state that has been my home more than 40 years) of which I had little knowledge. I found the book to be especially helpful when combined with a history book that detailed events in a particular local. Well worth your money. This is especially true if the traveller leaves the interstates for the smaller by-ways.
