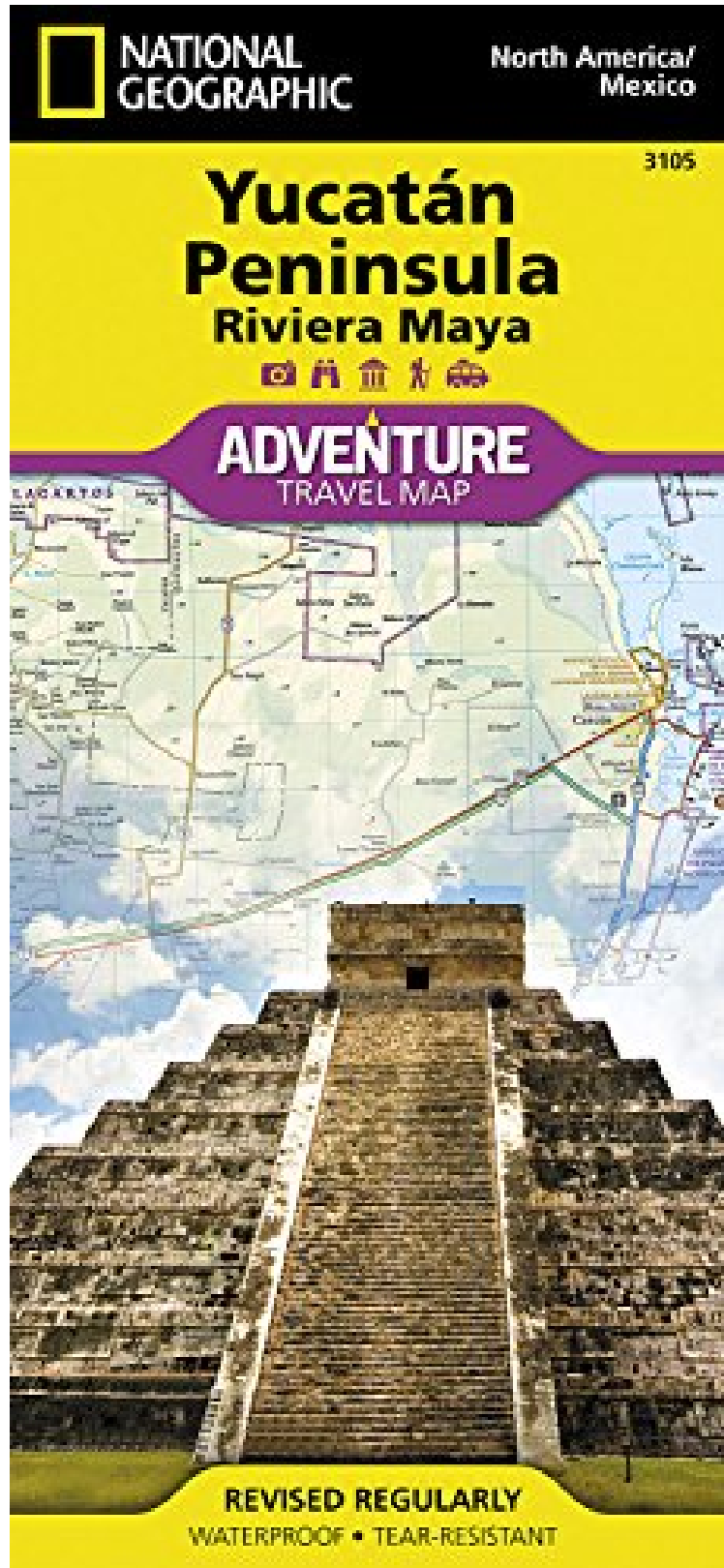

It was also helpful because it showed the location of ruins, many of which we decided to visit because they were on the map. It may be missing fine detail and is not helpful for navigation in cities but it was met our needs. It is made from very durable paper that withstood the many abuses inflicted upon it, including spilled water and footprints from sandy shoes, during the road trip. I had no idea National Geographic made adventure maps until recently when I was given a copy of their Northern Yucatan Peninsula Adventure Map. I didn't have it with me on my trip but I wish I had. One side has a map of the Northern Yucatan Peninsula with detailed city insets of Cancun and Merida; the other side has information -- plus maps -- of the Yucatan's most important archaeological sites. And it's made of waterproof-tear-resistant material so you won't have to worry about ripping it or getting it wet.
