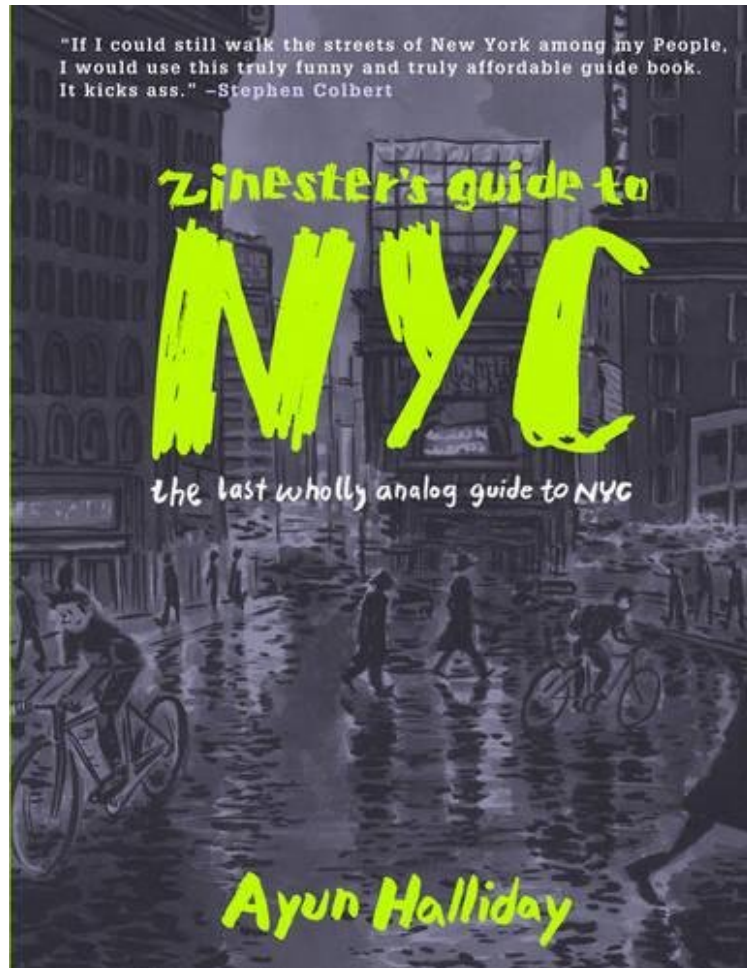

One of my favorite NYC days (I'm an ATL native, people) was spent at the very beautiful New York Public Library in Mid-Manhattan, then at a hole-in-the-wall Vietnamese restaurant in LES, capped by a jaunt to Pearl's in Bushwick.
